




# **FOUNDATIONS**

Through a variety of mini-games, students receive explicit instruction in the underlying phonological awareness, phonics, vocabulary, and early comprehension skills that are necessary for fluent reading.



# LEARNING TO READ

As students progress, they build up their reading accuracy and fluency. They continue to hone key skills, learn strategies to understand novel words, and receive explicit instruction in critical comprehension skills such as main idea, anaphora, and inference.



# Narrative progression


# READING TO LEARN

# Elementary

# Independent study/rotation stations

Amplify Reading is a personalized program designed to keep students engaged and on task during independent study. When teachers are working in small groups, they are confident that the other students are focused on the skills they need to practice. The program is most effective when used for a minimum of 45 minutes per week.

# Flexible use

We designed the program to be flexible enough to fit any classroom model. Amplify Reading is browser-based, so it works on Chromebooks, iPads, laptops, and desktops. It can also be used at home to extend learning beyond the classroom.

# Response to intervention

Many teachers find Amplify Reading extremely helpful as an addition to their RTI program. They use it in class one or two times a week for 20 to 30 minutes over the course of a year.

# **Test preparation**

Teachers also use the program to introduce or reinforce key close reading concepts in the core curriculum, for extra practice or homework, and for after-school and summer school programs.



# **Elementary school**

On average, a kindergarten student who began at the 50th percentile increased to the 66th; a first-grade student who began at the 50th percentile increased to the 73rd percentile.

### Middle school

Over an average of 18 school days, seventh-grade students who began in the 50th percentile would, on average, score at the 61st percentile during post-testing.
