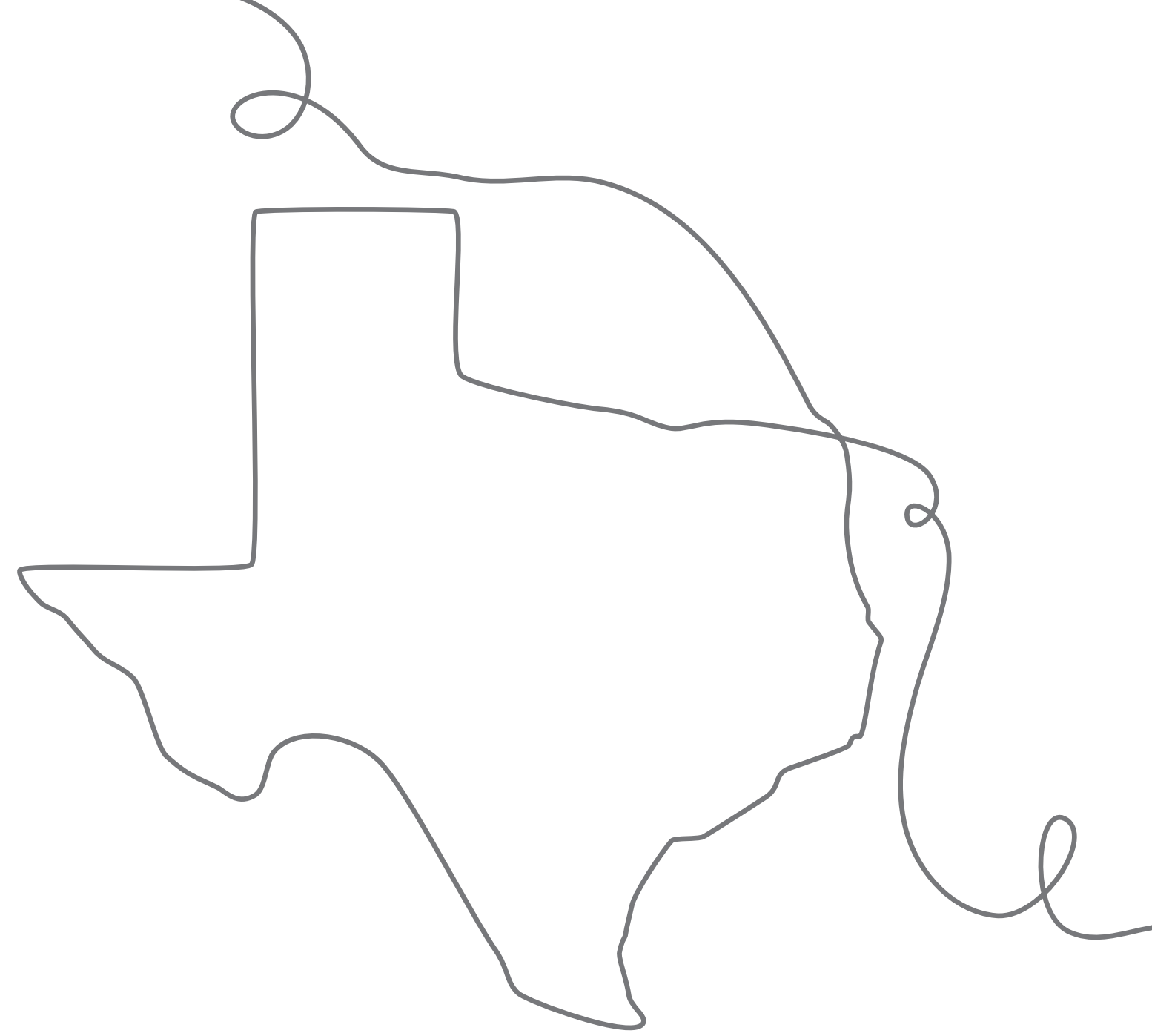

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Flip Book Introduction

Depending on your classroom configuration, you may need to have students sit closer to the Flip Book in order to see the images clearly.













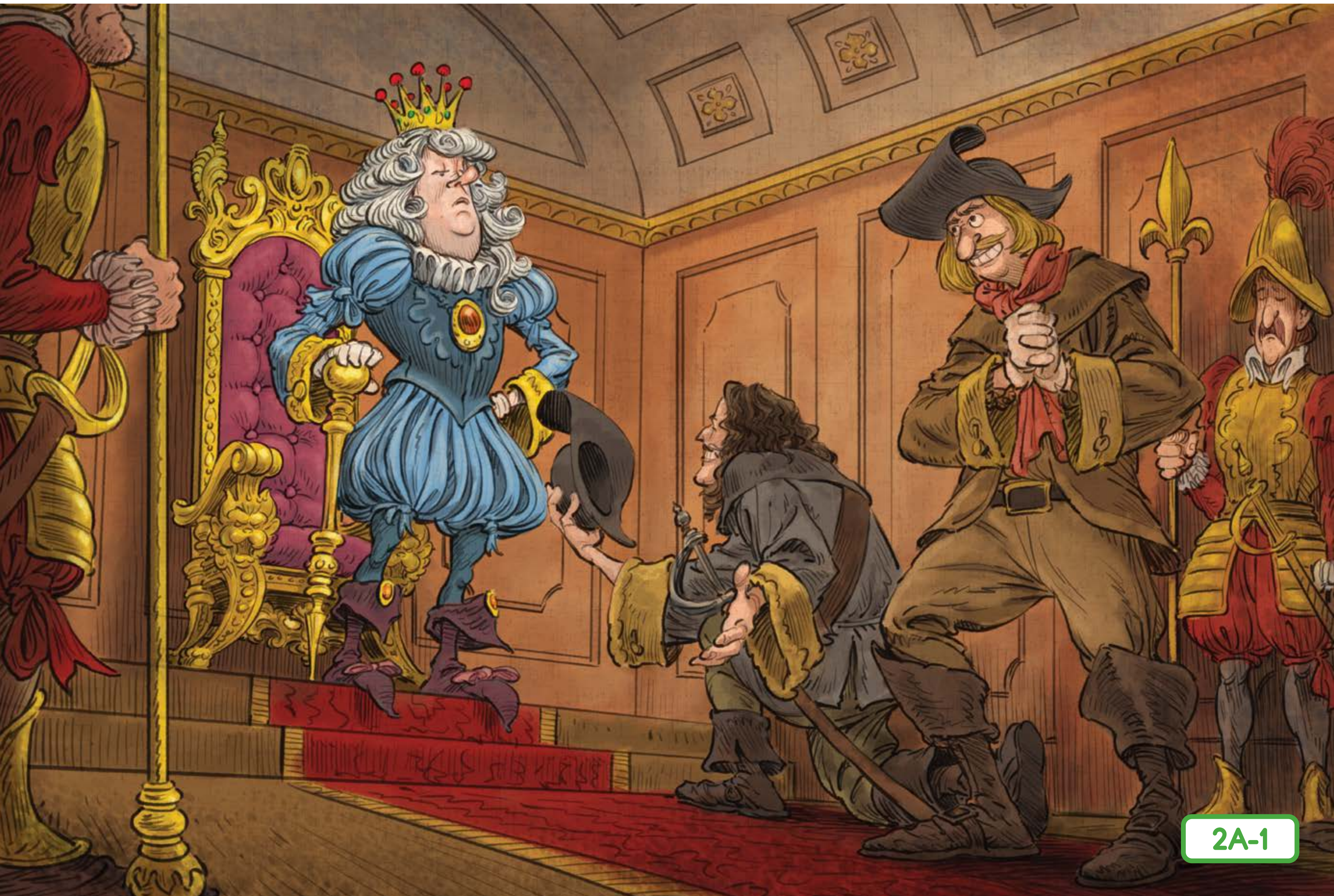










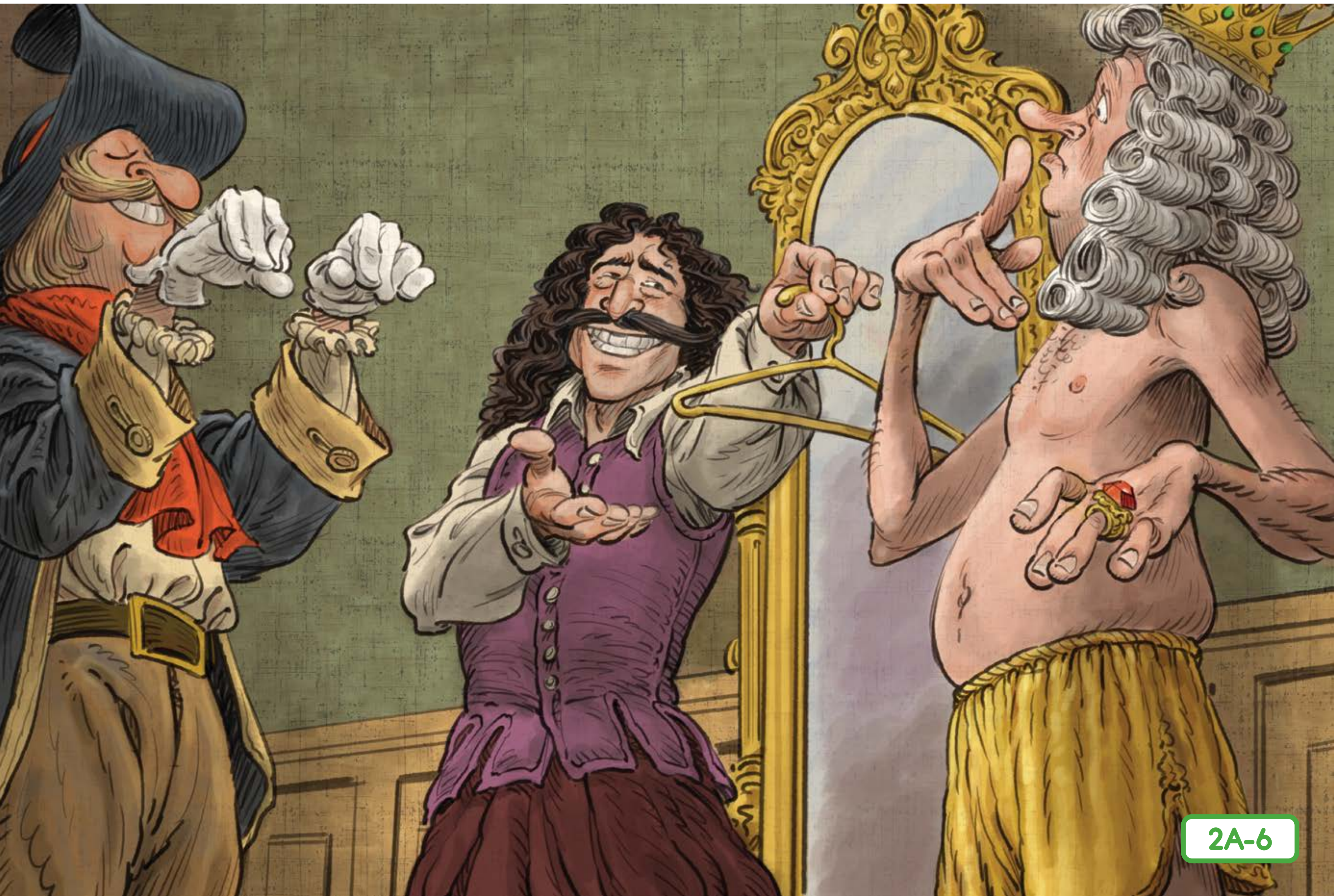


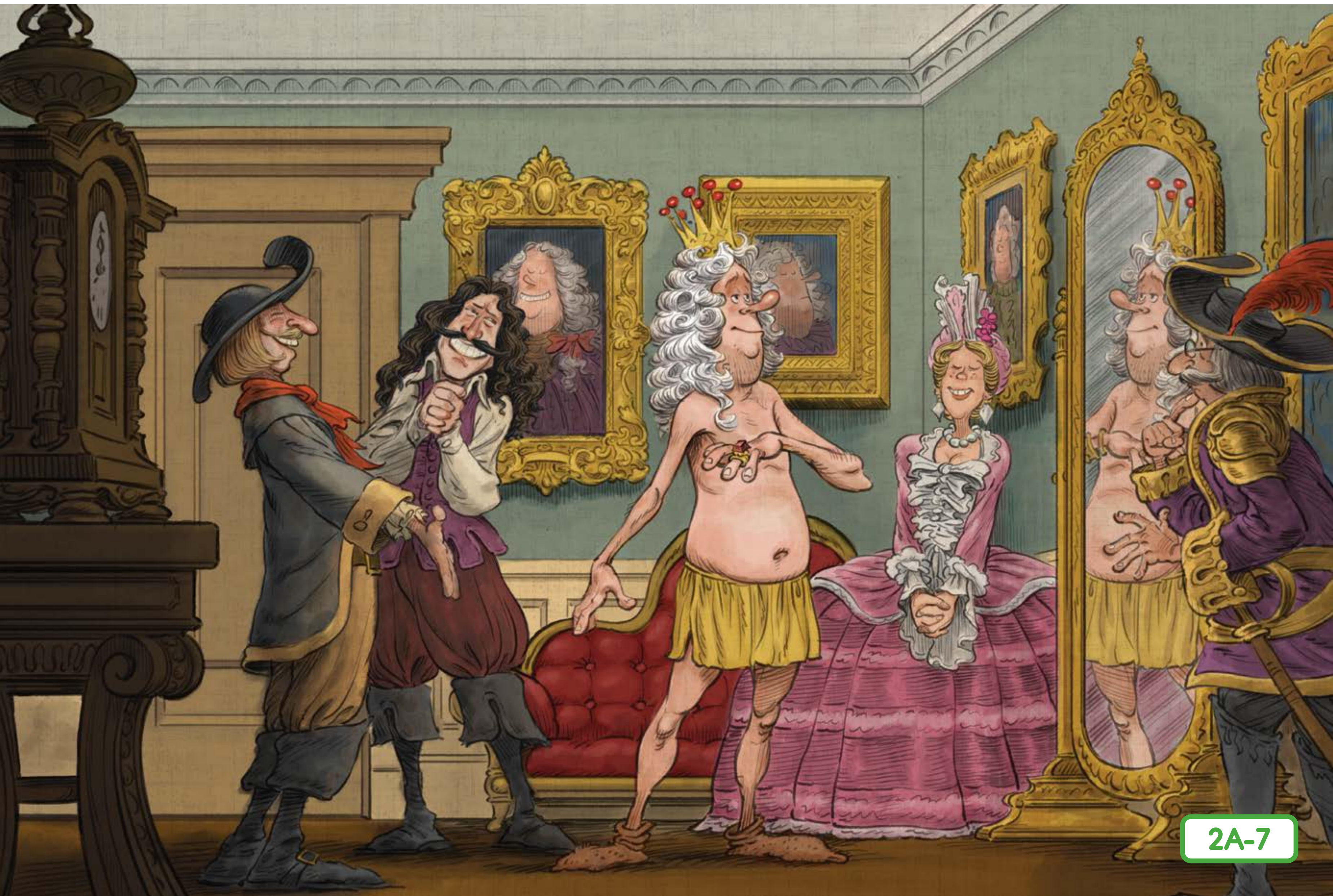


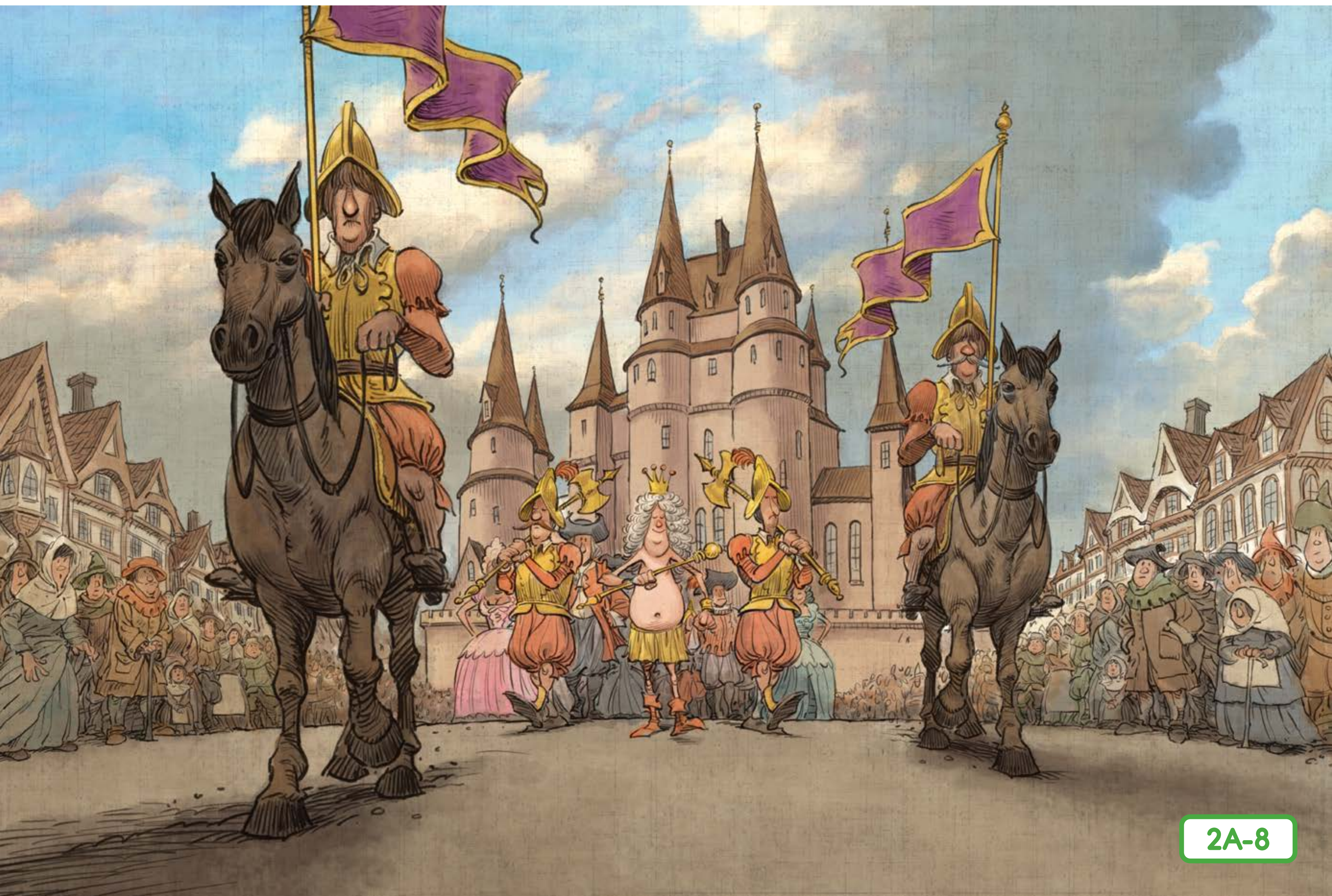








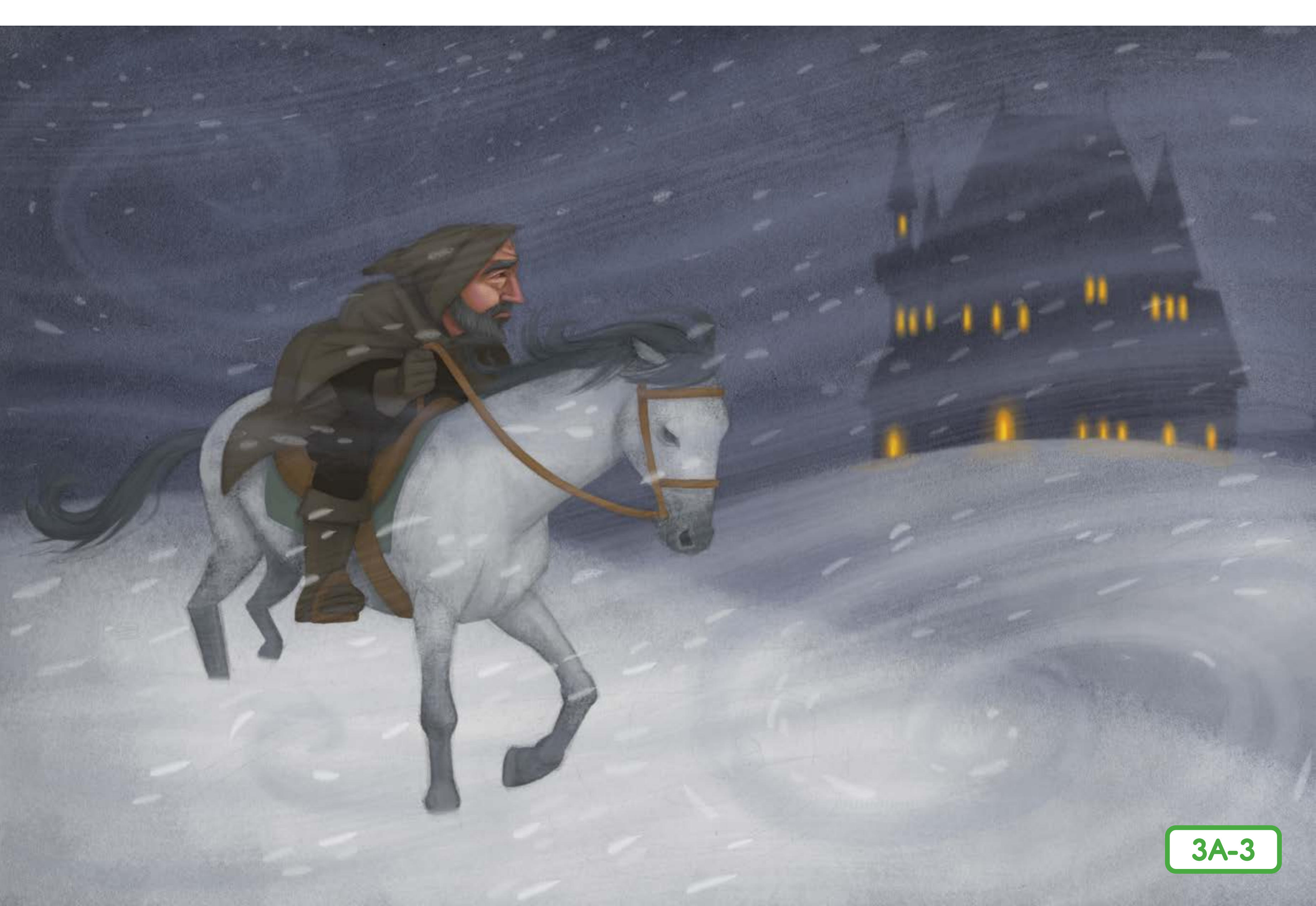






























































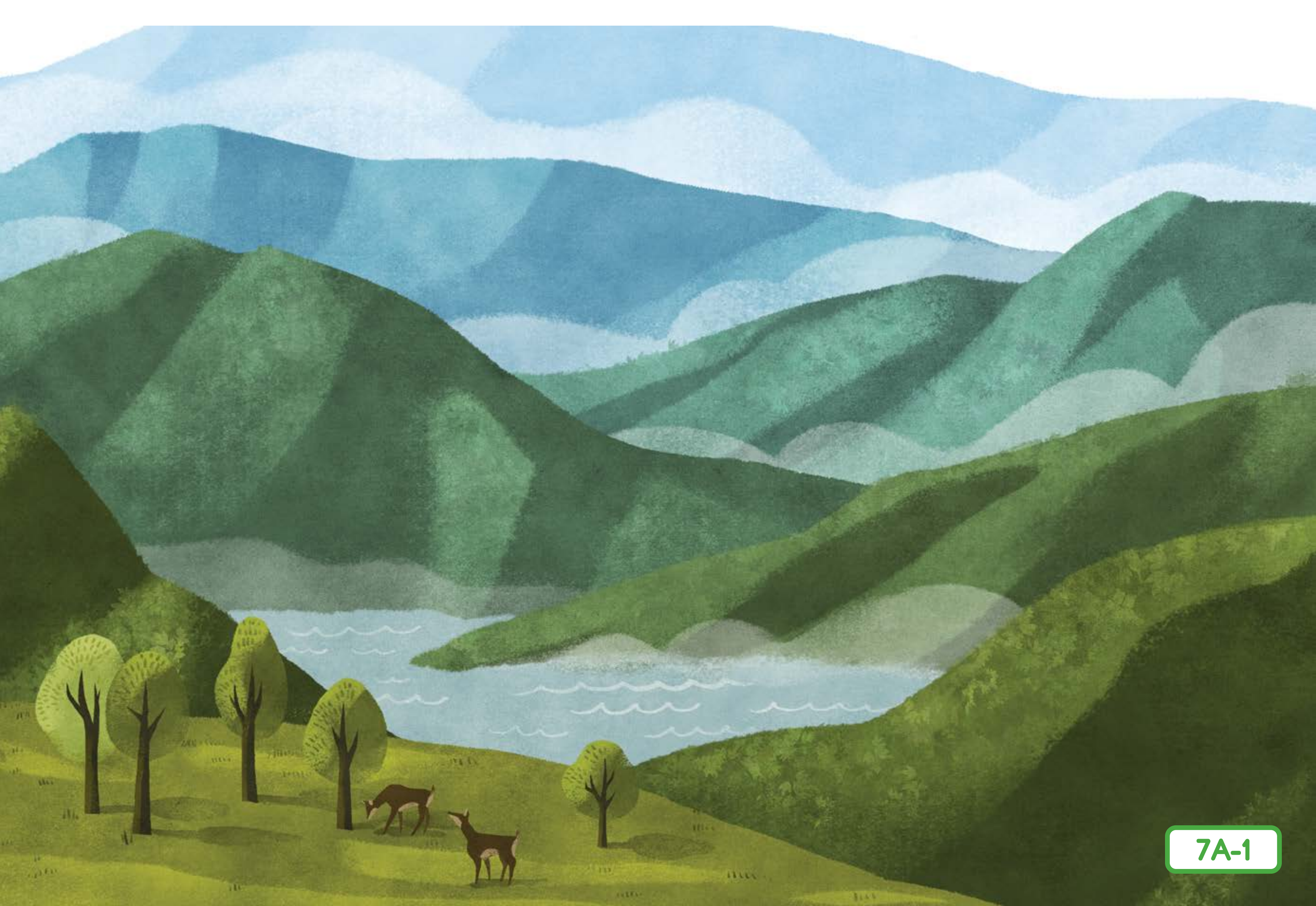


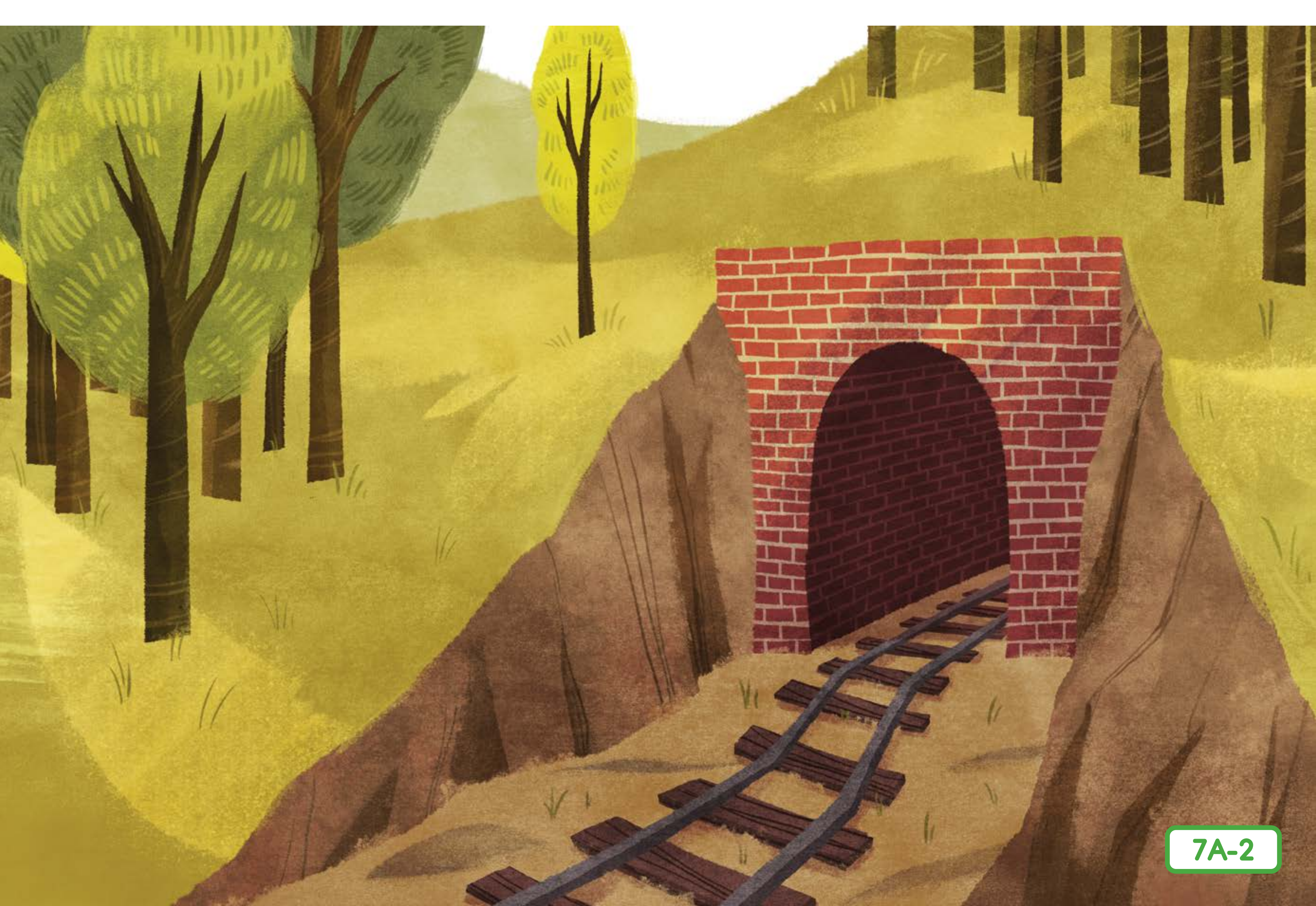










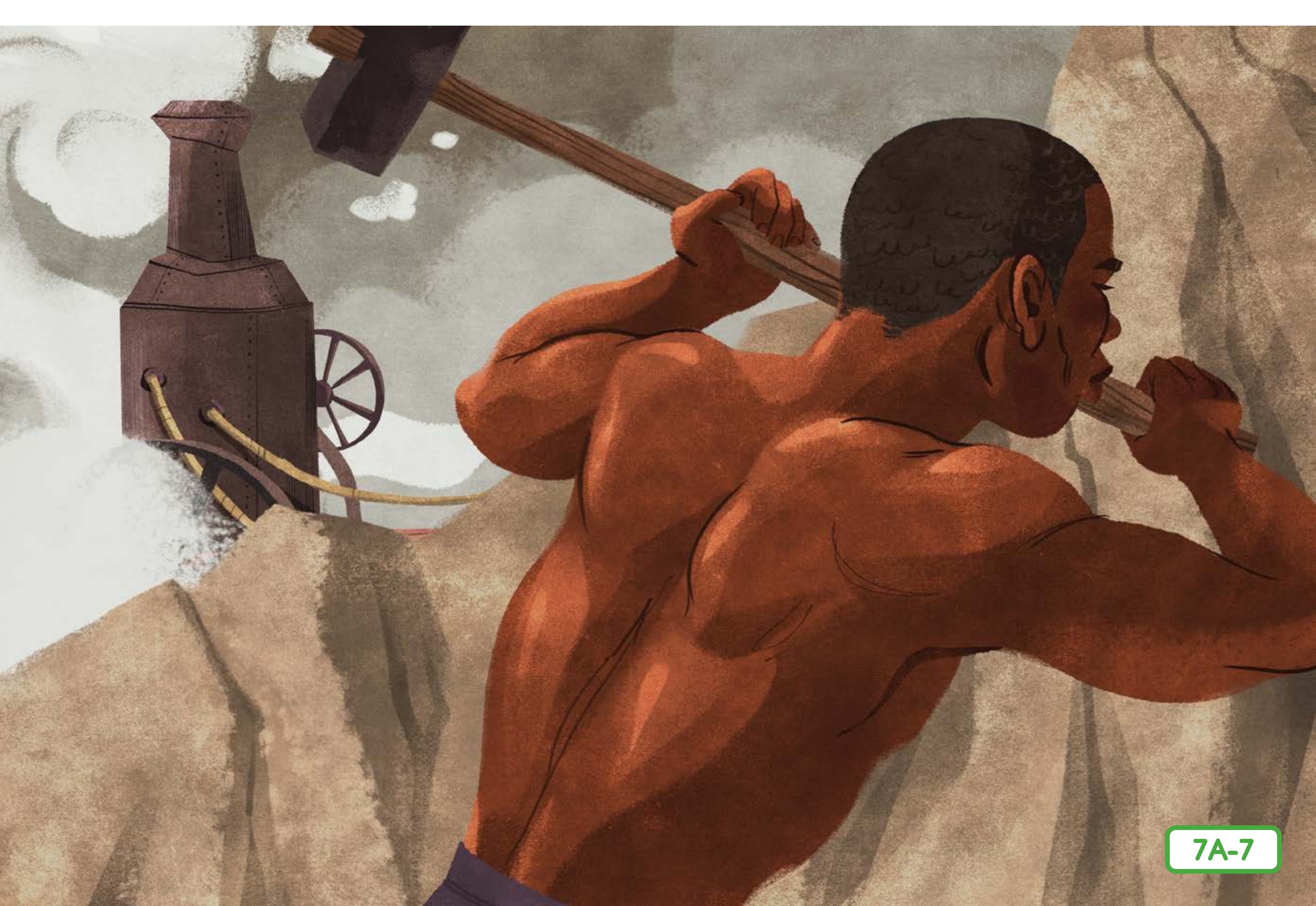






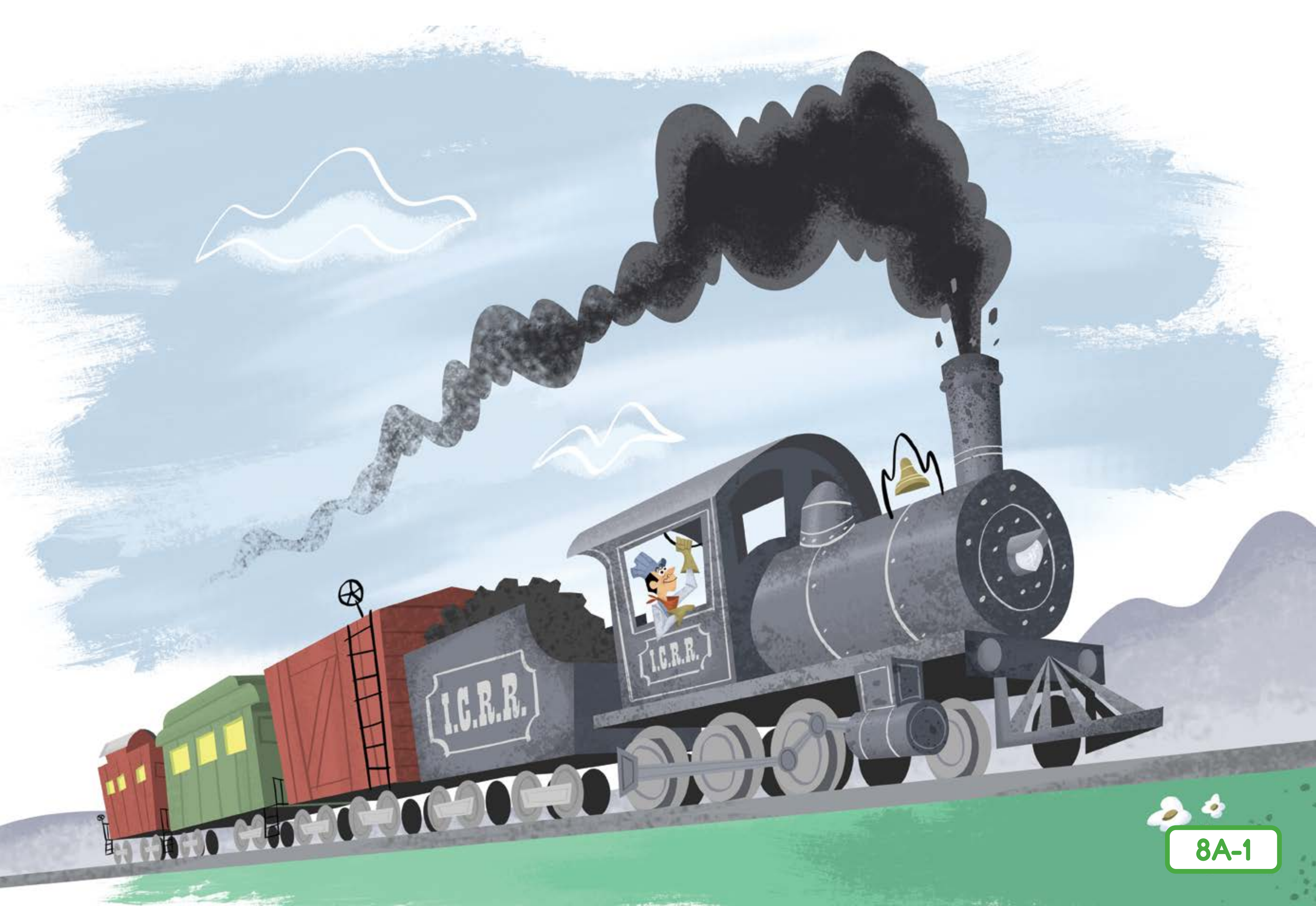












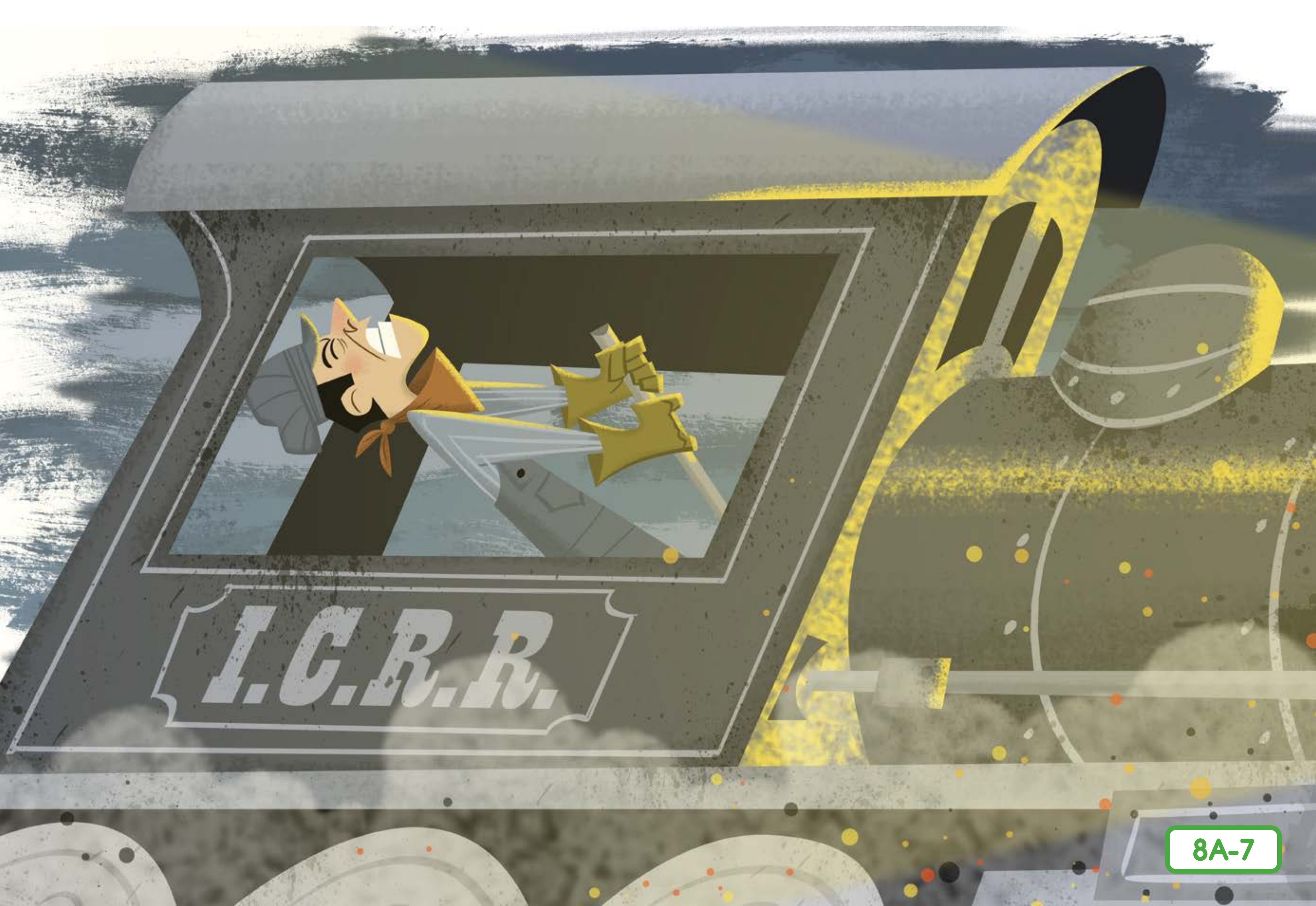


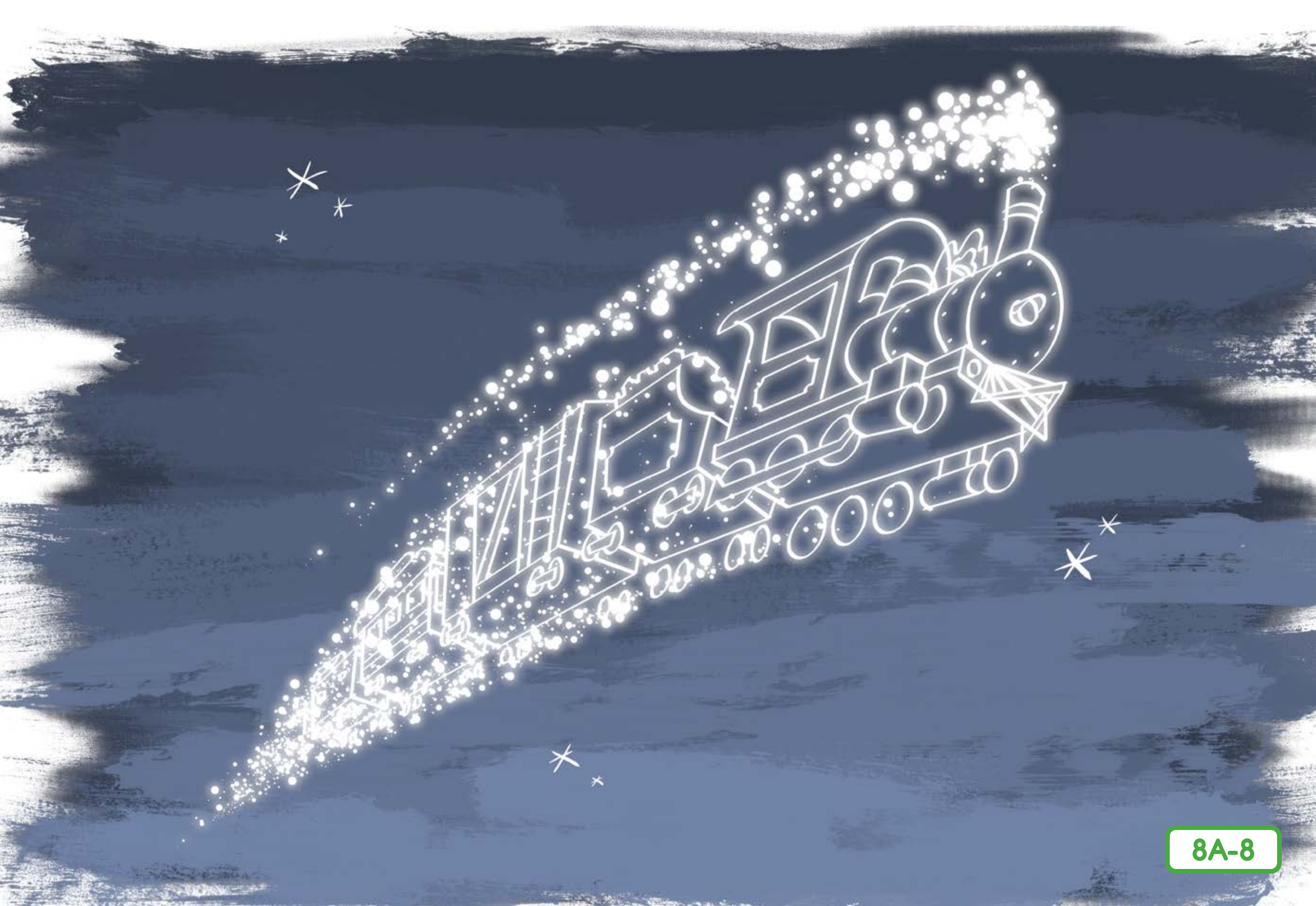

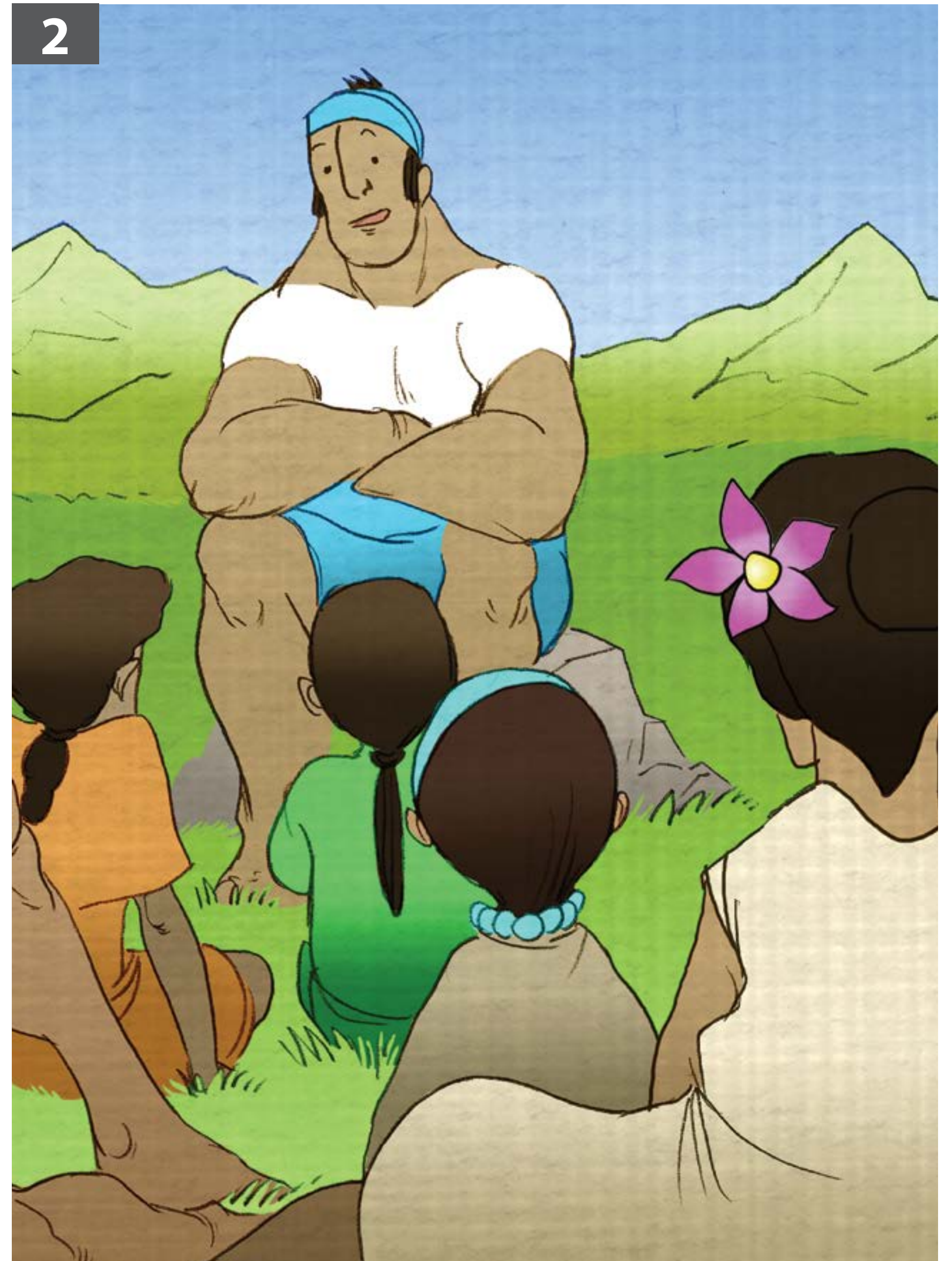
Tunes (Poster 2M)

2. to make small changes to something in order to make it work better (*verb*)

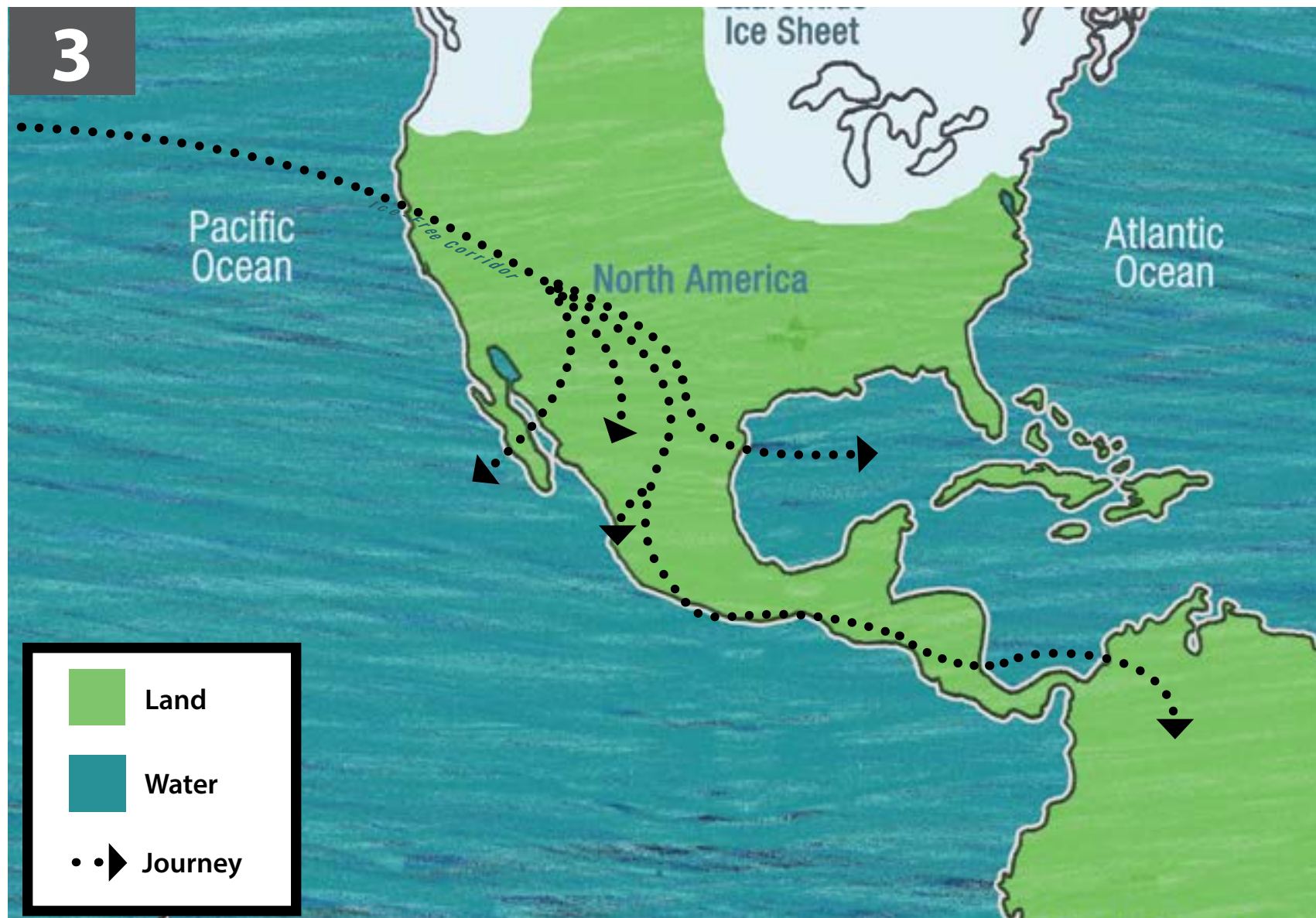

1. a famous or important person who is known for doing something extremely well (*noun*)
2. a story from the past that is believed to be true (*noun*)
3. a list of symbols on a map (*noun*)

1. a pair of metal bars that a train, trolley, or subway car rides along (*noun*)
2. marks left on the ground by a moving animal, person, or vehicle (*noun*)
3. follows or watches the path of something (*verb*)
