Grade K Curriculum Map

Knowledge 7: All Around the World: Geography

Unit Summary

This domain introduces students to the study of geography, helping them gain a better understanding of the world beyond the place they call home. Students learn about globes and maps, what they represent, and how to use these tools to answer questions such as where students are located, where other places are located, and how near or far these places are from students' own location on Earth.

Students identify and locate the continent they live on, as well as their country, state, and city or town. They also identify and locate the remaining six continents and five oceans on Earth, fostering a sense of curiosity about the world and its vastness. Students begin to think critically as they ask and answer questions about geographical knowledge and the characteristics of specific regions. Students learn that all people—both past and present—live differently in different geographical regions.

Writing Focus

In this domain, students use details to describe key concepts in informational texts about geography, employing drawing and writing to identify important characteristics of various world locations and describe their proximity to where students live. They choose a location to illustrate on a postcard, write an informative description of their journey, and present their postcards to the class. Students combine and expand sentences in shared language activities related to the Read-Alouds.
