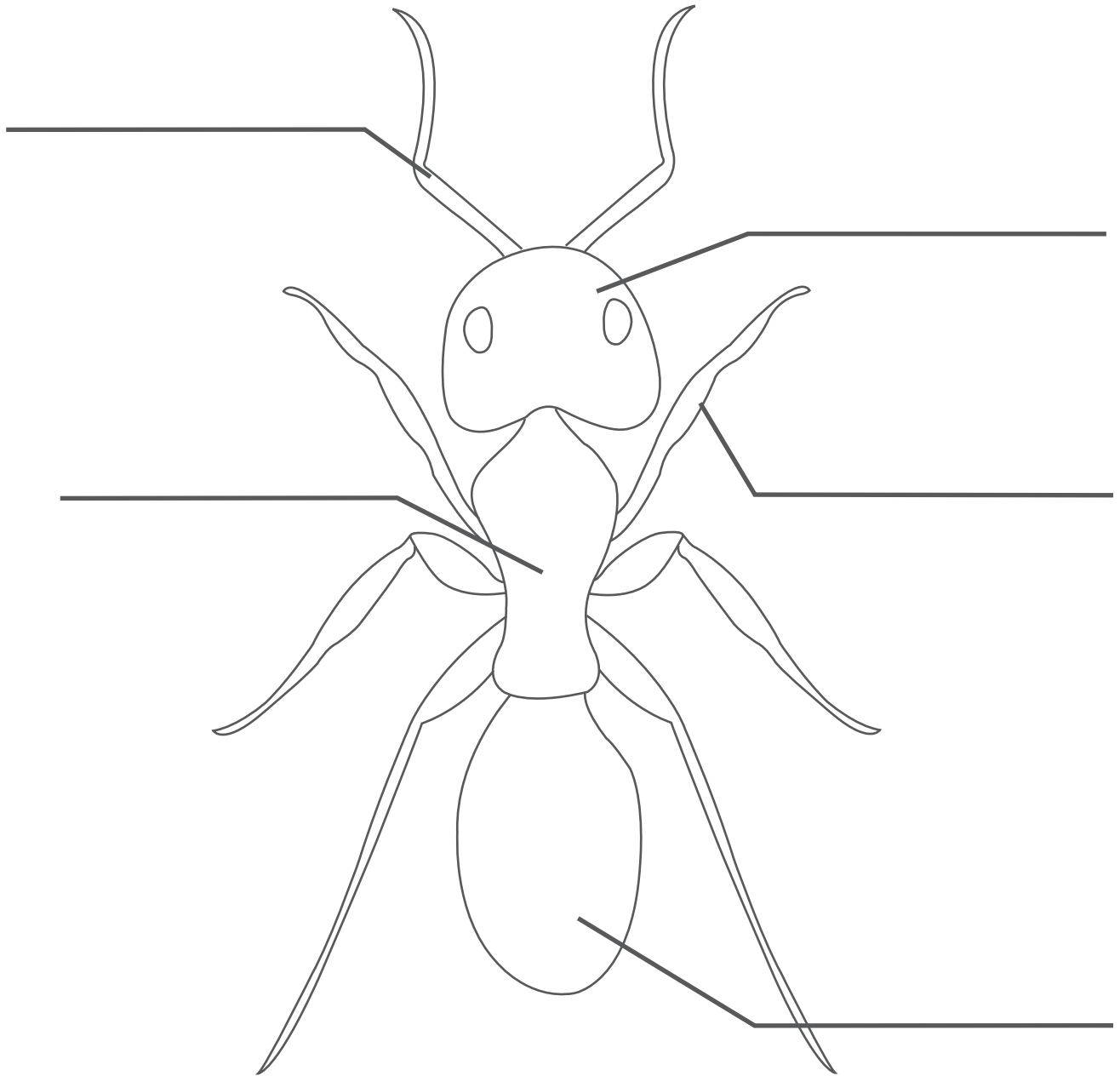

Honey bees and other pollinators help make flowers and fruit.

Dung beetles break up dead material and return rich nutrients to the soil.

The Colorado potato beetle damages crops.

Honey bees give us beeswax, used to make wood polishes and candles, and even lipsticks.

Cockroaches walk across our kitchen countertops and can poison our food and make us sick.

Insects are food for other animals, insects, and humans.

Some mosquitoes carry malaria, a deadly disease.

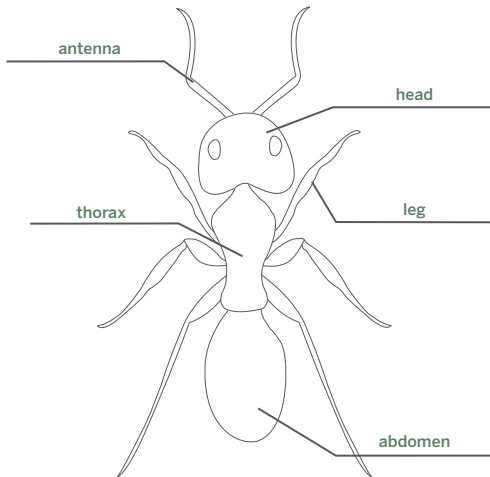
